Curators note on the Long Point Gallery

I literally grew up in the Long Point Gallery, as my Father, artist Budd Hopkins, was a very active member of the Gallery. I was little and I listened. Because I was always the only small child around at openings, parties and meetings I was often ignored as insignificant. This did not insult me as I learned more from not being noticed. The brilliant adult artists around me would continue on oblivious of my presence which allowed me to hear everything and learn a lot about the world of art, literature, music and politics.

It was my second home and social scene in the summer and I was devastated when it closed in 1993. The course at the Open University of Wellfleet and exhibition at Berta Walker Gallery are an homage to the men and women who loomed large in my more formative years.

Founded in 1977 by 13 Cape artists-and closed in 1998 -- this important co-operative gallery revitalized the Provincetown art colony, spawned new galleries, and attracted dealers and collectors in its heyday. Its importance grew with the importance of Provincetown, recognized in 2010 as "home of the nation's oldest art colony" by the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

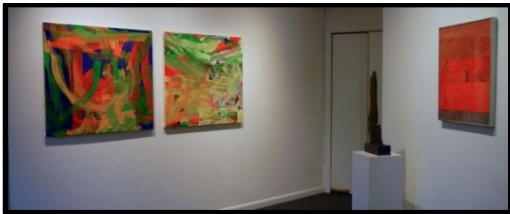
In the mid-20th century the town became both cradle and hub of the revolutionary Abstract Expressionist movement. Having opened its first art school in 1899, the legendary Hans Hofmann taught here for 35 years, joined by artists like Franz Kline, Mark Rothko and Jackson Pollack. In time Robert Motherwell arrived, and became one of the founders of the Long Point Gallery.

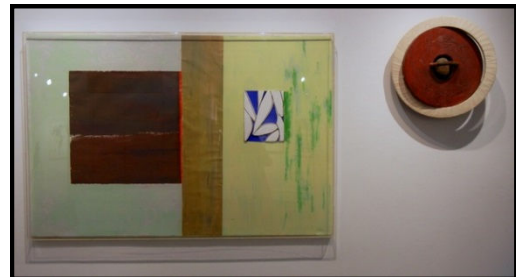

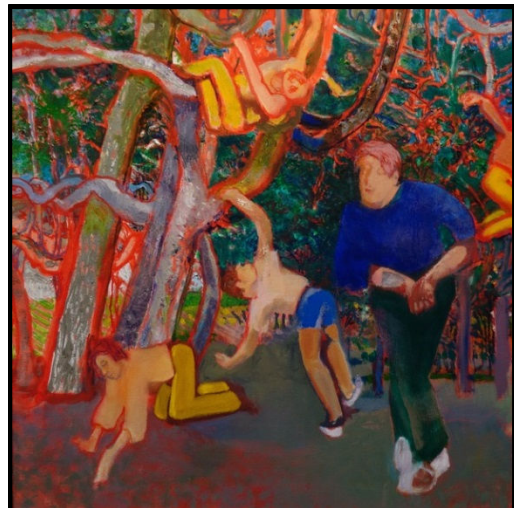
